In response, **India** launched **Operation Vijay**, deploying over 200,000 troops to the region to counter the incursion. Then Pakistani’s Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif agreed to withdraw Pakistan troop. So 26<sup>th</sup> July has been marked as “Kargil Vijay Diwas” for Indians.

## VIJAY DIWAS

The day is observed on December 16 annually to commemorate the victory of the Indian Forces over Pakistan during the 1971 war. Vijay Diwas mark the decisive victory over Pakistan in 1971 which resulted in the creation of Bangladesh and in the liberation of East Pakistan.

On December 3, the Indo-Pakistan war began in 1971 and lasted for 13 days. Officially, the war ended on December 16 and Pakistan surrendered to India. The thirteen-days war resulted in the complete surrender of Pakistani forces and the creation of Bangladesh. The army of Pakistan surrendered before India with around 93,000 soldiers. It was the "**Greatest Ever Victory**" and India rose as a regional power to reckon with.

On 3 December 1971, Pakistan Air Force carried out preemptive aerial strikes on 11 Indian Air Force stations, setting off hostilities between the two rival nations. The day also marked India's entry into the liberation war being fought in East Pakistan, which is now Bangladesh.



## RANK CEREMONY

On July 26, 2024, Kargil Vijay Diwas will be commemorated to pay tribute to the courageous Indian soldiers who valiantly fought in the Kargil War. The Kargil War resulted in the loss of 527 soldiers from the Indian Army. The conflict concluded on July 26, 1999, when the Pakistan army was forced to retreat from their occupied positions, signifying India's triumph. Since then, this day is observed as Kargil War Diwas to honour and remember the supreme sacrifice made by the soldiers during the war.



# INDEPENDENCE DAY

Independence Day is celebrated annually on 15 August as a commemorating the nation's **Independence from the United Kingdom** on 15 August 1947. Independence Day is marked throughout India with flag-raising ceremonies, drills, and the singing of the Indian **National Anthem**. Additionally, various cultural programs are made available in the state capitals. After the **Prime Minister** participates in the flag-raising ceremony at the **Red Fort** historic monument in **Old Delhi**.



On 15/08/2024 is 78<sup>th</sup> Independence Day. The theme of the 78<sup>th</sup> Independence Day is “**VIKSIT BHARAT**” or “**DEVELOPED INDIA.**” This symbolizes India’s goal of becoming developed 2047. As a part of Independence Day celebrations several events had took place for one week.

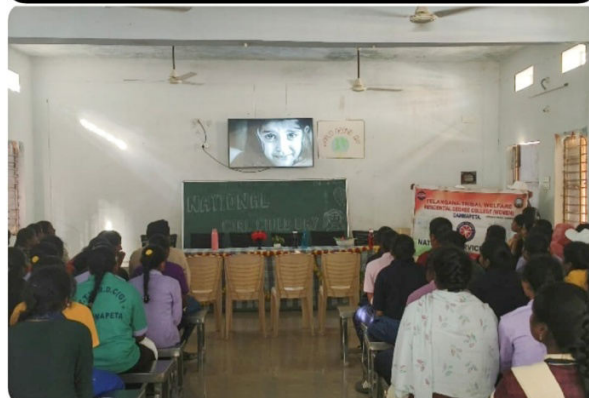

# VIJAY DIWAS -2025

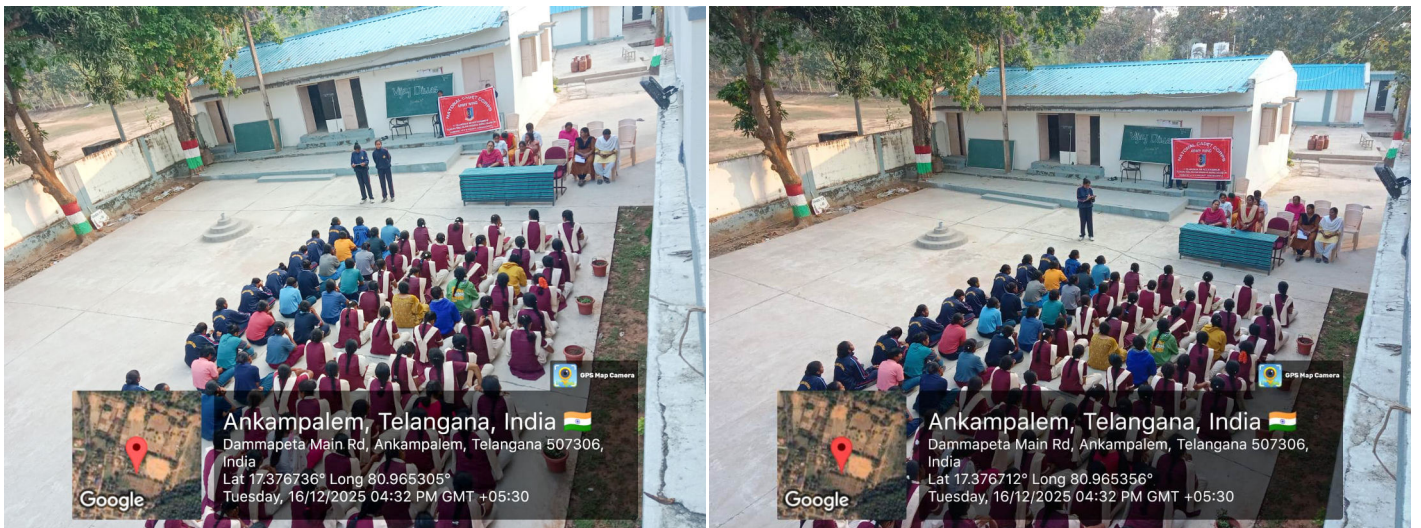

**Duration:** May 18th – May 27th, 2022

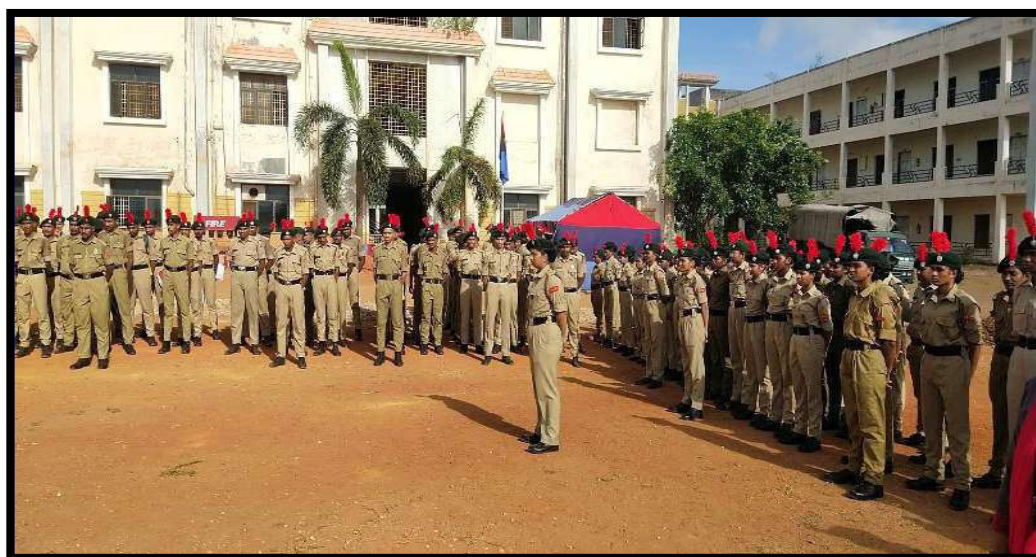
**No. of Participants:** 05 Cadets
