NSS SPECIAL CAMP

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Special Camp was organized from 28.03.2026 to 05.03.2026, at the Sarampalle village. This 7-day camp focuses on creating awareness on cleanliness, health, education, and environmental protection while encouraging social responsibility among students.

Objectives:

- To develop the personality of students through community service.
- To give students a first-hand experience in community service.
- To create awareness among the villagers about importance of cleanliness, health and environmental protection.

5. The programme brought awareness among the villagers on the importance of cleanliness, health, and environment.

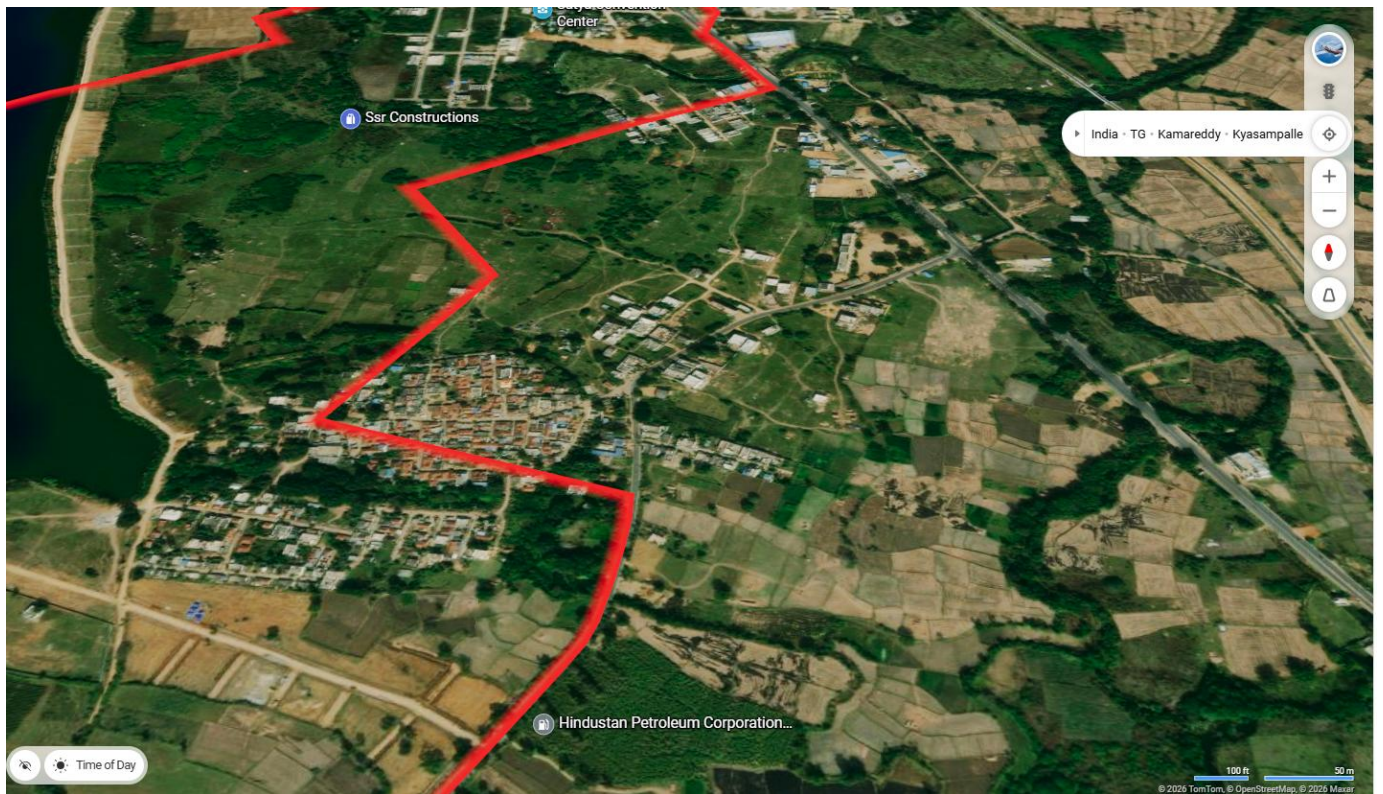

DAY 1

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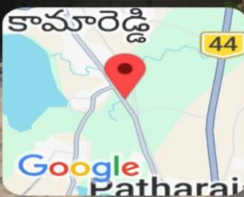
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School Visit, Student Interaction, Fun Games, Future Awareness and Motivation

The programme was successfully conducted with active participation of NSS volunteers and school students, creating awareness and enthusiasm among the children.



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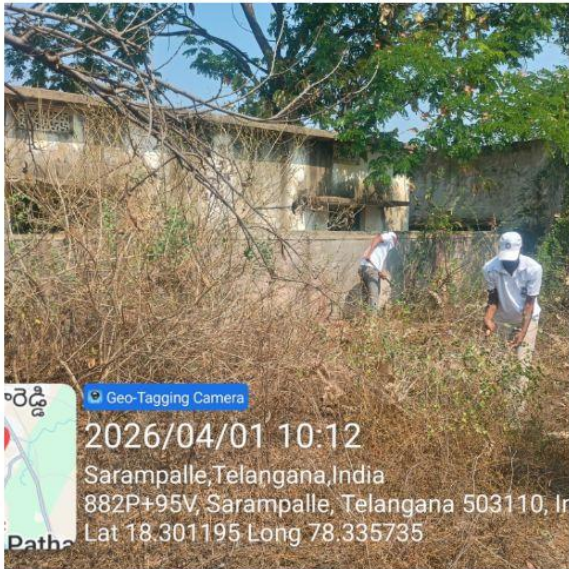
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Veterinary Awareness Programme

- **Cleaning of Sarampalle lake ghat area.**

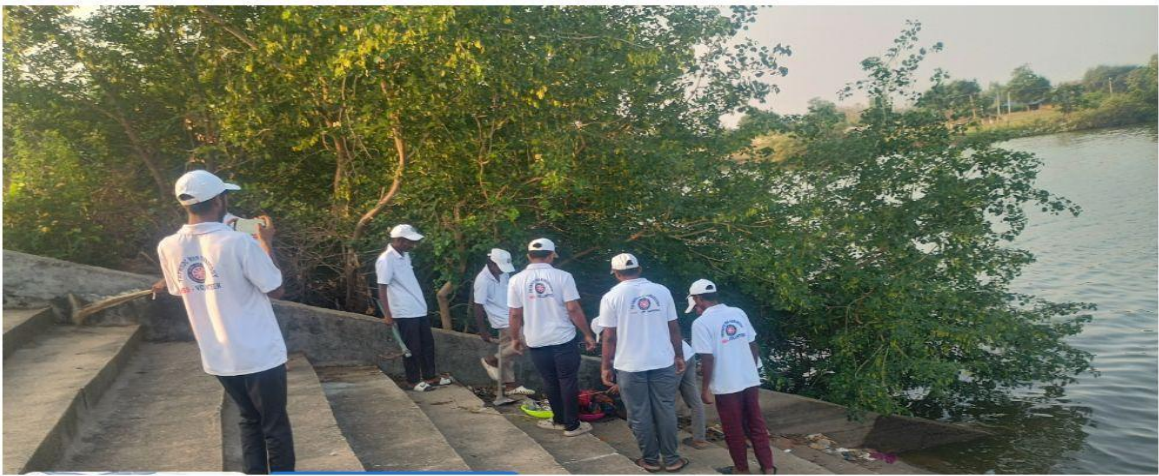
On the fifth day of the NSS Special Camp, activities focusing on environmental protection and cleanliness were conducted in Sarampalle village.

The programme was successfully carried out with active participation of NSS volunteers and created awareness among villagers about environmental protection and the importance of caring for birds during summer.

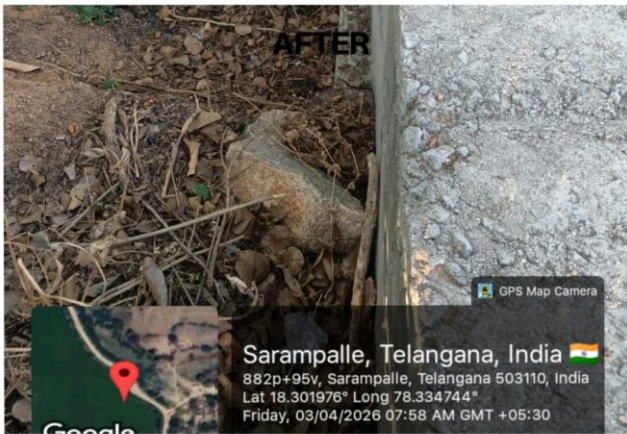












Anganwadi Visit & Health Awareness Programme

Day 6
