SUMMARY OF THE EVENT:

On This day, we hosted a pivotal awareness program on women's abuse in collaboration with PLAN India. The session aimed to educate and engage the college community on the critical issues surrounding women's abuse and to provide actionable steps for prevention and support.

The program commenced with an introduction by R Swathi, DL in Physics, who outlined the objectives and importance of the initiative. The session was designed to address various forms of abuse, including physical, emotional, and sexual, and to foster a deeper understanding of these issues among students and faculty.

PLAN India contributed significantly to the event by sending expert speakers, including Rahul (Programme Coordinator), Sujatha (Programme Officer) who provided an insightful presentation on the realities of women's abuse. Their discussion highlighted the prevalence of abuse, its impact on victims, and the social and legal frameworks in place to address these issues. The presentation was both enlightening and thought-provoking, prompting many attendees to reflect on their roles in combating abuse.

Following the keynote address, the program included an interactive Questionnaire facilitated by PLAN India's team. These workshops engaged participants in role-playing scenarios and group discussions, helping them to

recognize signs of abuse, respond effectively, and support those affected. The practical exercises were designed to enhance empathy and equip attendees with skills to make a positive difference in their communities.

The session also featured a discussion segment where attendees had the opportunity to ask questions and seek advice from the experts. This open forum allowed for a dynamic exchange of ideas and provided clarity on complex issues related to women's abuse.

To conclude, the program offered a range of resources and support materials, including contact information for local support services and educational pamphlets. Attendees were encouraged to utilise these resources and to reach out for help if needed.

Emergency contact no police helpline - 100, women helpline - 181, Child helpline - 1098. Also many acts like POCSO ACT, UNSE ACT, ICC, LCC, IEC were also discussed by the officials to the students.

Overall, the awareness program was a resounding success, achieving its goal of raising awareness and fostering a supportive environment. Feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing a newfound understanding and commitment to addressing women's abuse. The event underscored the importance of ongoing education and engagement in combating gender-based violence and reinforced the college's commitment to social responsibility and advocacy.
