Major SALSA Schemes and Programs

1. Free Legal Aid Services:

- o To persons eligible under Section 12 of the Act (e.g., women, children, SC/ST, poor).
- o Includes court representation, legal advice, documentation support, etc.

2. Lok Adalats:

- o Alternative dispute resolution forums.
- o Encourage amicable settlements, especially for civil and compoundable criminal cases.

3. Legal Literacy Camps:

- o Conducted in villages, jails, schools, and slums to spread awareness.

- o Use of street plays, posters, and community meetings.

4. Legal Aid Clinics:

- o Established in law colleges, community centers, and remote areas.
- o Provide first-contact legal guidance.

5. Victim Compensation Schemes:

- o Especially for women affected by domestic violence, rape victims, and acid attack survivors.

6. Special Schemes for Marginalized Groups:

- o Legal aid for transgender persons, senior citizens, disabled persons, prisoners, and bonded labours.
